

“Right With God or Not Right With God?”

Galatians 2:14-21

Series: Justification by faith alone in Christ alone

Paul’s conversation with Peter: Galatians 2:14 -

“But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all...”

Terms to understand:

“Gentile Sinners” – anyone outside of the Jewish people who wasn’t following O.T. Mosaic law.

“Justified” – declared right and pardoned by God, because by faith one has embraced Christ’s death on the cross as a substitution for one’s own guilt. Jesus took our place.

“Works of the law” – being circumcised, eating certain foods, sabbath laws and any human effort to be right with God based on observing and living out moral law.

“Faith in Jesus Christ” – the opposite of depending on my own actions to earn my salvation. Total surrender in trust and obedience to Jesus Christ.

“For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his (God’s) sight...” Romans 3:20

“Israel who pursued a law that would lead to righteousness did not succeed in reaching that law. Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith, but as it were by works. They have stumbled over the stumbling stone (Jesus)...” Romans 9:31-32

“For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.” Ephesians 2:8-9

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
